



Wetwheels was founded in 2011 by disabled yachtsman Geoff Holt MBE DL.

Wetwheels provides barrier free boating opportunities for disabled people of all ages, including those with profound and complex, often life-limiting disabilities.

One of the USP's of Wetwheels is everyone, including wheelchair users, has the opportunity to drive the boat under supervision from a qualified skipper. Each Wetwheels boat is an MCA coded vessel carrying a maximum of 10 participants, of whom three can be wheelchair users.

Wetwheels boats are built at Cheetah Marine in Ventnor on the Isle of Wight. Our key partners are Suzuki Marine who provide our engines and Raymarine who provide our marine electronics.

We now have seven Wetwheels boats located as follows;

- 1. Wetwheels Solent, Portsmouth (2011)
- 2. Wetwheels jersey, Channel Islands (2013)
- 3. Wetwheels Hamble, Southampton (2016)
- 4. Wetwheels Yorkshire, Whitby (2018)
- 5. Wetwheels south-east, Dover (2018)
- 6. Wetwheels south-west, Falmouth (2020)
- 7. Wetwheels Edinburgh (operational from September 2022)

To date, Wetwheels vessels have taken in excess of 40,000 disabled people from within their local communities and providing Outreach work.
